Audrey Harrold, 88, of New Holland, Pennsylvania, passed away peacefully and free of pain on the morning of March 18, 2017. She was a resident of St. Anne's Retirement Home, Columbia, Pennsylvania. Audrey was born in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania to the late Louetta Dell Hauer and the late Clark Hauer. She was preceded in death by her husband of 47 years, Don Harrold, who passed away in 2001.

Audrey was a homemaker and private bookkeeper and a member of Trinity Lutheran Church, New Holland, Pennsylvania. She served more than a decade as a board member and treasurer of the New Holland Area Meals on Wheels and her family was surprised to find, in her final days, just how much she took that organization to heart.
