Beverly Ann Thomann, 78, of Lancaster, PA, went home to be with her Savior, Jesus, on Saturday, June 28, 2025, at Ware Presbyterian Village, Oxford. Born in Northampton, PA, she was the daughter of the late Pauline Grace (Musselman) and Rev. David E. Thomann.

She received a bachelor's degree from both Nyack and Kutztown Universities. It was at Kutztown that she experienced the onset of blindness at the age of 27. Beverly spent her career working for the Berks County Association for the Blind in Reading, PA, where she was a case worker for 30 years. She also enjoyed visiting schools and teaching the kids about Braille, guide dogs, and other related topics. After relocating to Lancaster upon her retirement, she volunteered and played piano at the Faith Bible Fellowship Church's Children's Ministry. She enjoyed listening to talking books and crocheting. She started "Tabitha's Stitchers," a group of volunteers who enjoyed making things for her church.

Beverly is survived by her sister, Elizabeth Frable (Arthur) of Bixby, OK; nephews, Jeffrey Frable, Brian Frable, Aaron Frable, and David Thomann; nieces, Tricia Warfel and Tara Wise, all of whom affectionately called her "Annie." In addition to her parents, she was preceded in death by her brother, Rev. David A. Thomann, as well as her furry working companions, Candy, Annie, Blaze, Flyer, and Freddie.
