Charles "Chuck" Kronenberg III, 76, transitioned to God's Light and Peace on Wednesday, September 28, 2022. Born in Baltimore, MD, he was the loving son of the late Charles and Mary Kronenberg.

A graduate of Lasalle University, Chuck initially worked as an English teacher, but for the majority of his professional life, he served as the Director of HDC Weatherization Program.

Chuck always aspired to be a champion of justice and equal rights for all and devoted his life's mission to support the disadvantaged. He was inspired by Martin Luther King, John and Bobby Kennedy, and Cal Ripken because each

person upheld their vision, ideals and beliefs with strength and commitment. He enjoyed following the Orioles, organic gardening, creative writing, playing Scrabble and daily candlelight conversations with his beloved wife of forty years, Lois.

He was the embodiment of a loving, sensitive, spiritual, private, witty, kind-hearted, person who gave the world a light that will not be dimmed and never be forgotten.
