Clark C. Musser, 75, a life-long resident of Lancaster County, died on September 24, 2012 at Luther Acres in Lititz. Born in Lancaster on July 11, 1937, he was the second son of Wilbur and Lillian Clark Musser. Clark was to the end the loving and devoted husband of Barbara Eastman Musser for 53 years and the father of three children: Traci (Dennis) Downey of Lancaster, Kelly (John) Edgar of Landisville and Christopher who preceded him in death. Clark is survived by his wife, daughters and seven grandchildren (Bernard, Margaret Mary, Kara, Thomas, Anna, Daniel and Julia). He is also survived by his four siblings: Ronald Musser, Mildred Wimer, Barbara (Donald) Good and John Musser: Brother-in-law Brad Eastman and an extended family of nieces, nephews and cousins. Clark had many friends, dating back to his school days in Lancaster.

Clark graduated from McCaskey High School in 1955 and attended Millersville State Teachers College before enlisting in the United States Air Force. His tour of duty took him across the Pacific Ocean to Formosa, from which he returned to marry Barbara and to commence a long and distinguished sales career with Flexsteel Industries. He won numerous sales awards and was particularly proud of being a member of the company's Million-Dollar-Sales Club.

Clark was an extraordinarily generous and kind person, a true friend and a

compassionate spouse and father. He took a strong and active interest in his children's and grandchildren's well-being. He loved fishing and boating, especially at the New Jersey shore with his son, Chris, who died prematurely in 1993 at the age of 20. Clark was a jovial prankster in the most fun-loving sense of the word and he loved practical jokes. He embodied a quiet spirituality and lived the Golden Rule. He loved the song Amazing Grace and often hummed along as his daughter sang its words in his last days.
