Constance A. McCollough, 81, of Lancaster died on Wednesday, July 27, 2016 at the Lancaster General Hospital after a brief illness. Born in Lancaster, she was the daughter of the late Clair R. and Velma Dilworth McCollough.

Constance was a graduate of Lancaster Country Day School, Mount Vernon College, and Dickinson College. Miss McCollough was a lifelong member of First Presbyterian Church. She was a former board member of the Junior League of Lancaster serving as corresponding secretary and on many committees. She continued her active involvement as a sustaining member until the time of her death. She also served on the Wheatland Board and the Rock Ford Board. Additionally, she supported many other organizations which included the Fulton Opera House, Lancaster Museum of Art, North Museum and Planned Parenthood. She was a member of the Hamilton Club and the Lancaster Country Club. Miss McCollough's other interests were reading and traveling. She traveled extensively in Europe and Asia and many other areas including North Africa, the Caribbean, Russia, Canada and the United States.

Constance worked for Neiman Marcus, Palmer Green, Palmer and Gilmore and Blue Cross and Blue Shield in Dallas, TX. Additionally, she was employed by TV Guide in Wayne, PA. Upon her return to Lancaster PA, she was an Executive Assistant with WGAL TV.

She is survived by several cousins.

A Funeral Service for Miss McCollough will be held at the First Presbyterian Church, 140 East Orange Street, Lancaster, PA 17603 on Monday, August 1, 2016 at 11:00 a.m. with The Rev. Dr. Donald W. Hackett officiating. Relatives and friends are invited to meet the family from 10:00 a.m. until the time of the service. Private family interment will be held at Greenwood Cemetery.
