Daniel Estabrook Beede, 75, of New Holland, PA, passed away on Friday, September 13, 2024, at Lancaster General Hospital. Born in Concord, MA, he was the son of the late Everett Bennett Beede and Hildreth (Wheeler) Beede.

Dan grew up in Concord, MA, and graduated from Concord-Carlisle High School in 1967. He served honorably in the United States Air Force, before moving to Pennsylvania. In 1989, he returned to Concord, MA where he lived until the Fall of 2018, when he returned to Pennsylvania and resided in Lancaster and later in New Holland until his death.
