David Horton Scott, 72, of Lancaster, PA, died on Wednesday, August 13, 2014, at The Glen at Willow Valley. Born in Lancaster, he was the son of the late George W., Jr. and Margaret Horton Scott. He was a long-time resident of Philadelphia and Haverford.

He was a graduate of J.P. McCaskey High School, Bucknell University, and the American Bankers Association's National Graduate Trust School at Northwestern University. At Bucknell, he was the recipient of the Wall Street Journal Award for Academic Excellence in Finance.

David was a Bank Examiner for the Federal Reserve Bank of Philadelphia and later for the Pennsylvania Department of Banking and Securities. At both institutions, he was responsible for examining bank trust departments and was an expert in trust management.

David was a member of St. James Episcopal Church, Lancaster. He avidly followed the stock market and enthusiastically participated as an investor. He enjoyed music, especially Broadway shows, and collecting art, particularly antique Audubon bird prints and railroad prints and watercolors by local artists. He was a strong supporter of the Demuth Museum and the Heritage Center of Lancaster.

He is survived by his brother, George W., III ("Bill") husband of Gail Scott of Bethesda, MD, and a sister, Kathryn Scott of Tallahassee, FL, three nieces (Darcy, Abigail and Julia) and two nephews (Blair and Will).
