E. Parke Rohrer, 89, of Lancaster, PA, died Wednesday, August 28, 2013, at Calvary Fellowship Homes. Born in Lime Valley, PA, he was the son of the late Enos Heller and Myrtle Shaub Rohrer and was married for 14 years to Dorothy Barnes Rohrer, and the late Janette Valk Rohrer who died in 1997.

Parke served in the United States Army Air Corps and graduated from New York University with an Engineering degree and worked at Rohr Aircraft Company, Daniel Mann Johnson & Mendenhall, and Brookhaven National Lab. He was a project manager for construction of the Fermilab in Batavia, IL and the Cameron Townsend Memorial Building at JAARS in Waxhall, NC. He later returned to Brookhaven Lab where he retired as Associate Director in 1994. He was a member of Calvary Church, Lancaster.

In addition to his wife, he is survived by a daughter, Rosalind, wife of Tim Christenson, and four sons: Jonathan, husband of Sharon Rohrer; David, husband of Aimee Rohrer; Daniel, husband of Susana Rohrer; and Steven, husband of Jennifer Rohrer; 21 grandchildren; one step-grandchild; and five great-grandchildren.
