Earl "Joe" Campbell, 94, of Lancaster, passed away on Tuesday afternoon, April 18, 2017 at The Mennonite Home, where he had been a guest for over a year. Born in Providence Township, Lancaster, he was the son of the late Lawrence J. and Mary Stoner Campbell and was the husband of the late Blanche Stauffer Campbell, who passed away in 2009.

He served with the U.S. Army during World War II and had received the Purple Heart. An automotive mechanic, Joe owned and operated, Campbell's Garage on Cabbage Hill for many years, until he retired in 1970. After his retirement, he and Blanche traveled extensively throughout the United States, Canada and Mexico in their motor home from 1970 until 1995. He also enjoyed playing cards, especially poker and bridge.

Joe will be lovingly remembered by his daughters; Gloria Campbell, companion of Stephen L. Powell and June, (Joseph) Leshinskie all of Lancaster, his two granddaughters; Kristen, (Curtis) High and Mandy, (Dustin) Delp and his great grandchildren, Dalton Campbell High, Sawyer Jackson High and Madyn Grace High and his sister Mary Arlene Rutt of Blairsville, GA.
