Edward J. Bien, 90, of Lancaster, passed away at his home on Tuesday evening, June 6, 2017 following a three month illness. Born in Hazelton, PA, he was the son of the late Anthony and Stella Lishinski Bien and the husband of the late Clara L. Bielskie Bien, who passed away on July 20, 2013.

A 1945 graduate of Hazelton High School, Ed served in the U.S. Army during the Korean Conflict with the 13th Armored Inf. Battalion, 3rd Armored Division.
