Edward H. Staedtler, 90 of Willow Street, formerly of Bucks County went home to be with his Lord and Savior on Monday, January 31, 2011. He was the son of the late Gustav Wilhelm Staedtler and Anna Andler Staedtler. He was a 1937 graduate of Olney High School in Philadelphia and attended Drexel University.

Mr. Staedtler was a decorated World War II veteran who proudly served in the United States Army from 1941 until 1945. He landed on Omaha Beach during the Normandy Invasion and was a commander of a tank platoon in the Second Armored Division during the Battle of the Bulge.

He was the owner of Staedtler Opticians in Lakeside and with his wife Charlotte, owned and operated Lifeline Christian Supply Store at Five Points. Mr. Staedtler was a dedicated member of Calvary Baptist Church of Bristol where he served on the board and taught Sunday school for 30 years.

He is survived by his wife Charlotte of over 68 years, a sister, Dolores Brunner of Huntington Valley, his sons, Richard (husband of Edith) of Holland, Donald (husband of Susan) of Levittown, and his daughter Deborah Rowland (wife of Robert) of Pottstown. He is also survived by seven grandchildren and nine great grandchildren.
