Ellen Arnold Groff, 67, of Lancaster, died on Saturday, July 28th, 2012, at the Lancaster General Hospital. Born in Newburgh, NY, she was the daughter of Barbara Durkee Kennedy of Lancaster, and the late Reverend Alfred C. Arnold Jr. She met her husband, Robert F. Groff, Jr., at St. James Episcopal Church in 1976, and together they shared 36 years of marriage.

She graduated from William Smith College, Geneva, NY, and received an Honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters from Franklin and Marshall College in 2008. After moving to Lancaster, Ellen worked as an artist, and freelance designer. In 1980, Ellen joined her husband at Fred. F. Groff, Inc, where she served as a Vice-President until her retirement in 1999.

Amongst all of her community involvements, Ellen is a trustee emeritus and former board member of Franklin and Marshall College, and four-time past President of the board, and recently-named trustee emeritus of the Fulton Theater. She served on the boards of Actors' Company of Pennsylvania, Lancaster County Community Foundation, Leadership Lancaster, the Museum of Archeology and Anthropology at the University of Pennsylvania, and Warfel Construction Co. She was also founding member and president of the Cultural Council of Lancaster County, and former board President and life trustee of the Lancaster Museum of Art.

She was a member of St. James Episcopal Church, where she served as Senior Warden of the Vestry, chairman of the 250th Anniversary Committee, and Co-chair of the present Capital Campaign. She was also a member of the Healing Arts Commission of Lancaster General Health, the de Tocqueville Society of the United Way, Daughters of the American Revolution, the National Society of Colonial Dames, the Lancaster Country Club, and the Hamilton Club, where she served on the Art Committee.

Ellen is survived by her six children, R. Fred III, husband of Robin Shoop Groff, of New Holland, PA, Sanford H., husband of Nancy Nickel Groff, of Wayne, PA, Lisa M. Groff, of Lancaster, David W. Groff, of Phoenix, AZ, Laura L. Watt, wife of Clark Thompson, of Philadelphia, PA, and Timothy I. Watt, husband of Amity Gaige, Amherst, MA, two brothers, John C., husband of Betty Arnold, Simpsonville, SC, James J., husband of Liz Arnold, of Manheim, PA, and ten grandchildren.

“ To the Groff Family,

To honor and remember Ellen I want to write some things that she taught me:

1. Ellen taught me to be classy. She was always dressed like a million bucks, and even though she was short she stood up tall and you knew she was important. Aside from British royalty she is one of the few people I know that can rock a hat.

2. Ellen taught me humility. When I first moved to Pennsylvania I went to the outlets for the first time and bought a cheap pair of pants. I wore them to an event and Ellen said, "I really like those pants." I said, "Thanks! I got them for x amount of dollars at the outlets." Ellen responded, "When someone tells you they like something just respond 'Thank you.'" Now of course, as a young, sensitive lady I was taken aback by that statement. Now that I'm older I recognize the class and humility that comes with graciously accepting a compliment.

3. Ellen taught me to only swear for humor's sake. Now, Ellen did not realize she taught me this lesson, but I only heard Ellen swear if it was to retell a story, or to add humorous effect. In general it's not classy to swear and Ellen was a good example of this.

4. Ellen taught me table etiquette and love of well prepared food. Ellen was a fantastic cook, and her meals always had three wonderful courses. Whenever my family went to Ellen's to eat I learned how to correctly set a table. I learned which forks were used for each course (and yes, I used all of them throughout the course of the meal). I learned never to eat before the host takes her first bite. Most importantly I learned how fun an evening can be just sitting around a table and enjoying each other's company.

5. Ellen taught me to respect art. Now of course, this was something I already knew growing up with two artistic parents, but Ellen

solidified all their teachings. She had art all over her house. She supported artists by collecting their work and showcasing it for everyone to see. She also taught me to respect and enjoy other art forms, like the opera. She always had opera music playing, and she was a strong supporter of live theater.

6. Ellen taught me to be proud of my interests. In high school I was interested in theater as a career path. I jokingly called myself a theater geek, to which she responded "There is nothing geeky about it." I tried to explain that I was being positive. I loved being geeky about theater, but Ellen did not see anything geeky about it. It was important to love theater and be proud of that interest. Both Bob and Ellen Groff have always supported my interests, and taught me to be proud of them. My parents once told me that at a dinner they told Bob and Ellen that I would be going abroad again and that I had three choices. My parents knew I was struggling because I wanted to go to the Channel Islands, but people around me always think I should go somewhere more exotic. Both of the Groff's responded, "Well she should definitely go to the Channel Islands. Besides, she will like the living circumstances there much more than in India or Thailand." They were right.

7. Ellen taught me to laugh loud and hard. For those of you who know Ellen she has a very distinct laugh that fills an entire theater. You always knew something was really funny when you heard Ellen laugh, and she never tried to suppress it. She laughed loud, and she laughed with her whole body and it made an entire room fill with joy.

8. Ellen taught me self respect. I knew that she loved and cared about me, and that love gave me confidence. Ellen, as an individual is very confident and that taught me to respect and have confidence in myself.

9. Ellen taught me the importance of regular church attendance. Ellen was a faithful Christian that attended church service every week. And of course, she always wore a classy hat.

10. Ellen taught me love and loyalty. Ellen loved all the people around her, and even if she didn't love them she showed them respect. Most importantly she was loyal to those she loved.
