Eric H. Phillips, 20, of Oakland, CA died unexpectedly on Sunday, February 10, 2013 in Lancaster, PA. Born in Chicago, IL, he was the son of Byron E. Phillips and Sherri Q. Pittman, both of Oakland.

Eric was a graduate at The Head-Royce School in Oakland, California and currently was a sophomore at Franklin & Marshall College.
