Genevieve C. Winiarski, MD, 80, of Landisville, PA, passed away on Wednesday, May 13, 2020 at Conestoga View in Lancaster, PA. She was born in Brooklyn, NY, the daughter of the late Joseph and Loretta (Peltz) Winiarski.

She received her Bachelor of Science degree from Hunter College and then a Masters degree in Physiology from Columbia University, and her Doctor of Medicine from the Medical College of Pennsylvania. A general surgeon by training, Dr. Winiarski most enjoyed working in Emergency Medicine and spent a career managing people's urgent and emergent medical issues. In 1981 she began working in the Emergency Room at St. Joseph's Hospital in Lancaster, PA where she worked for more than 20 years.

She was a mentor to high school and college students who rotated through the Emergency Department inspiring many to a career in medicine. A warm and compassionate physician with a confident and genial bedside manner that was an example to all those who worked with her.

Genevieve was a member of St. Leo the Great Catholic Church. She had many hobbies including knitting, jigsaw puzzles, scrapbooking, gardening and any craft she could get her hands on. She was an amazing mother and friend and will be missed by many.

Surviving is her daughter Genevieve “Genie” Veneski, and her granddaughter, Isabella Burns.
