“ A little tidbit about George and I. While we were freshmen at Ft Hill High School we were 'trying out' for the JV basketball team. Recalling the list to make was only 7, maybe 8 kids, he and I were on edge to make 'the list' and as 9th graders had a slim chance because back in the day JV's were open to 9th and 10th graders. Varsity was for grades 11 and 12. The list was posted somewhere in the halls and much to our surprise we both "made it". This now set up a new problem for George...he was bused in from the western end of Salisbury Township by Cedar Crest Boulevard and would have to spend time between the end of class, about 3 pm and the basketball practice at 5. My parents invited him to our home each day of the season during those in between times. We regularly had a snack of Lebanon baloney sandwiches and milk, some cookies if they were available. After my freshman year I transferred to another school district and lost track of George and many of my friends. Fast forward to '87 or '88, at the Depot Restaurant in Bethlehem I bumped into George and some mutual friends of ours. We exchanged pleasantries, chatted awhile and I noticed George with a distant expression and asked him if all was okay. He says to me with a smile, I remember the Lebanon baloney sandwiches we shared at your house during basketball season in our freshman year at Ft Hill.
