Glenn Lee Myers of Lancaster, PA, died peacefully in the arms of family and close friends on Thursday, November 27, 2014 at Lancaster General Hospital. Born in Lancaster, he was the son of the late Leslie E. and Rena Burns Myers. He was the lifelong companion of J. Kim McNabb.
