Gregory Taylor, 65, of Lancaster, PA died on Saturday, November 24, 2012 at Lancaster Regional Hospital. Born in Washington, D.C., he was the son of the late Rubert and Bertie Sheluy Taylor. He celebrated 33 years of marriage in June with his wife Joyce Gwynn Taylor.

He served in the U.S. Navy receiving the Vietnam Service Medal with three bronze stars. Gregory worked for Stock Building Supply formerly known as Denlinger, Inc. for over 20 years as an IT Network Specialist and for the Lancaster County Public Assistance Office. He was a member of St. Mary's Catholic Church and volunteered for the Office of Aging where he did tax returns. Gregory enjoyed flea markets, fishing, computers, cooking and took several cooking classes.
