“ Growing up in the Boro, every summer we kids were always working the garden, harvesting vegetables, or picking fruit and berries to make jam. I still have a scar on my upper right thumb from when Harriet locked me out of the basement and my hand went through the window. We walked to Twin Oaks swimming pool out on Ironville Pike when it was just too hot for the galvanized wash tub filled with cold cistern water was not enough to cool us down. We never missed Sunday School or church, and we walked to YF (Youth Fellowship) at Salem E & R church in Columbia. After YF we walked to PennSupreme on Cherry St. for ice cream and called home on the 10 cents pay phone --- let ring twice and hang up --- signal to mom to come pick us up and 10 cents returned since call did not go through. In 1960-61 we lived in the VW Camper bus all 7 of us and traveled 36,000 miles around the US, Canada, and Mexico for an entire year. We froze at the Grand Canyon, and Harriet and Tina actually floated out of the tent on their air mattresses at Flagstaff, AZ during a torrential downpour. I think we visited every natural and historical National, State, and local park on our route and never passed a historical roadside marker without learning about what took place at that site. What an education that was !! We all skipped that year of school. As we grew and went our separate ways as years flew by, separated by distance and with work and family responsibilities, we were not together very often so there are countless other family and friends who made memories with Harriet. These cherished moments and memories we all share will live on in our hearts for all time ! Love and Peace Harriet !
