Harry Joseph Gundrum, 77, of Lancaster, PA, passed away on Saturday, May 25, 2024. Born and raised in Lancaster, he was the beloved son of the late John Harry Gundrum and Lorraine Vollman Gundrum.

Harry was a proud graduate of Lampeter Strasburg High School, class of 1964. He furthered his education at Franklin & Marshall College, earning a degree in Economics with a minor in Finance and Business Management in 1968.

His professional life was dedicated to the mortgage banking industry, where he left a significant mark. In December 1974, he acquired “The Walker Company” in Gap, PA, a venture he successfully managed until December 1989.
