Henry J. Stremba, 97, of Willow Street, formerly of N. Coventry Chester County died at his home on Saturday, March 5, 2016. Born in Harrisville, RI, he was the son of the late George and Christine Kollar Stremba and was the husband of the late Violet Bagor Stremba who died in 2014.

He graduated with a Bachelors Degree in Journalism from Temple University in 1950. He served in the US Marine Corps from 1943 to 1946 in the Pacific.
