Herman A. Rueger, 85, of Lancaster, PA., died Wednesday, Nov. 6, 2013 at his residence.

He graduated from Lancaster Township's James Buchanan School in 1943, and J.P. McCaskey H.S. in 1946. He received his B.S. in Aeronautical Engineering at the University of Pittsburgh in 1956.

During the Korean War he served in the Army 137th Ordnance Co. at Redstone Arsenal, Ala., and Ft. Bliss, Tex., where he was a "Guided Missile Internal Guidance Systems Repairman."

Mr. Rueger was associated with various aerospace companies during his career including: Wiley Manufacturing Co., Port Deposit, Md.; Ballistic Research Lab, Aberdeen Proving Ground, Md.; Glenn L. Martin Co., Baltimore, Md.; Pratt & Whitney Aircraft Corp., E. Hartford, Conn.

Mr. Rueger was an avid model builder, photographer, shooter, hunter, sailor, skier, and conservationist.

He was born in Brooklyn, N.Y., Feb. 20, 1928, a son of the late Helene Winnefeld Rueger and Herman W. Rueger. He was a member of the Unitarian Church of Lancaster. He is survived by a brother, Paul R. Rueger and family,
