Howard A. Downey, Jr., 67, died on February 5, 2014 after a 3-year struggle with cancer. He was the husband of Patricia Doohan Downey with whom he shared 42 years of marriage. Howard was the brother of Anne Gardner and her husband Gene of Lancaster, PA and Tom Downey and his wife Sue of Claremont, CA. He is also survived by nieces Victoria Gardner Coates, wife of George; Gretchen Downey Martin, wife of Ted; Claire Downey, Mollie Downey, and nephew Eugene Gardner, Jr, husband of Bernadette, and nine great nieces and nephews (Caroline, Victoria, Abby, Grace, Gardner, Gowen, Teddy, Charlie, and Annie) to whom he will always be their beloved “Uncle Pez.”

He was born the son of Howard and Jane Downey in Lancaster, PA, graduated from Conestoga Valley High School, and Penn State University as a proud member of the Nittany Lion Nation. Howard’s entire career, which advanced to senior executive positions, was with Unisys Corporation. There, he was recognized as a progressive global business leader, innovator and mentor; he touched and shaped the lives of many. During his career the Downey’s lived in England, in Ambler, PA, and finally in Florida.

After retirement in 2007, Howard made significant contributions as a volunteer working for the betterment of his Iron Horse Country Club neighborhood and the West Palm Beach community. He served those in need through the Palm

Beach Hospice. On January 11, his community honored him by renaming the main street of Ironhorse in his name and the day was set aside by West Palm Beach as Howard Downey Day. Howard was an avid golfer and contributed much to his golf club and to area golf.
