James V. Fulmer, 90, died on Saturday, February 21, 2026 at Homestead Village. Born in Newberry, SC, he was the son of the late Rev. V.L. and Edith Shell Fulmer and the husband of Martha, with whom he celebrated 66 years of marriage.

He was graduated from Marietta High School in 1953, received his bachelor's degree from Millersville University in 1957 and earned his master's from Western Maryland in 1960. Jim served our country with the Army National Guard for 6 years.

Jim was a teacher for 6 years before starting his small business consulting company, Marcoin. He was elected as Lancaster County Controller and alongside his wife, Martha, owned residential and commercial properties.

He was a lifetime Lutheran Church member, most recently with St. Peters Lutheran Church. He was a member of the Hamilton Club and the Lancaster Pirates.

In addition to his wife, Martha, he is survived by his son, Paul D. (Elizabeth) Fulmer, Lancaster and grandchildren: Paul Daniel Fulmer, Jr. and Carver James Fulmer. He was the youngest of 8 children, all of whom preceded him in death.

Family and friends will remember his distinct wit and undeniable charisma. He routinely carried a handful of Hershey's Kisses to brighten others' days, and when asked how he was, he would inevitably respond, "Sweet and lovable, good looking, and charming...just like you! Right?"

Services will be private and held at St. Peters Lutheran Church with an interment for family only at Trumbauer Memorial Cemetery in Leola.
