Dr. James Charles Thige Ndungu, DNP, 52, passed away on Friday, April 24, 2026. Born in Nairobi, Kenya, he was the son of William Thige and Benedicta Njeri.

James pursued his education with great dedication. He completed his undergraduate studies at both Slippery Rock University and Indiana University of Pennsylvania (IUP). He went on to earn a Post-Graduate APRN Certificate in Psychiatric/Mental Health Nurse Practitioner from Wilkes University. He continued his academic journey at Millersville University, where he earned both his Master of Science in Nursing (MSN) and his Doctor of Nursing Practice (DNP).

Following the completion of his education, James founded and established Primary Care of York, where he built a dedicated team and poured himself into caring for his patients. His entrepreneurial spirit and commitment to his patients were a true reflection of his passion for helping others.

Beyond his work, James was adventurous at heart — he had a deep love for traveling, hiking, and participating in marathons from time to time. He embraced every opportunity to explore the world around him. He was an active member of The Worship Center in Lancaster.

He is survived by his wife Grace Ndungu; his daughters, Lisa and Leila; his parents William and Benedicta; his three brothers, Stephen Kamau Thige, Fredrick Muhinja Thige, and Geoffrey Gathiru Thige; and his sister, Irene Murugi Thige.
