Kristie received her Bachelor of Arts degree in Theatre and Dance from Antioch College and her M. A. in Choreography from New York University She spent her professional career as a dancer in off Broadway in New York and other cities throughout the country. She was a dance teacher at Lancaster Catholic High School for the past 12 years and worked at the Dutch Apple Dinner Theatre, Susie Miller and Rhythm Methods in San Francisco, CA, Viktors and the International Ballet Academy of Dance, Lancaster, PA. She attended Unitarian Universalist Church of Lancaster.

Kristie is survived by her mother, two brothers Jeff husband of Patty Beatman of Chester, VA, Gus Beatman of Canberra, Australia; nieces; Meghan wife of Brian West and Kelly wife of Chris Long , Ella Beatman and nephews; Nicki and Aiodan Beatman .
