Laurent "Larry" Novikoff Horne, 82, passed away peacefully at UPMC Pinnacle Lititz on Sunday, July 7, 2019. Born in Wisconsin, he was the son of the late Franklin and Frances Hernamenn Horne and the husband of Mary Burton Horne with whom he celebrated more than twenty years of marriage.

Larry graduated from St. Marks Academy in Southborough, MA and Yale University. Larry was a lifelong expert Ham Radio Operator and collector of guns. Larry was especially proud of his Gatling gun which was prominently displayed in his home. An AA advocate, sponsor and supporter, he celebrated with great pride his 46 years of sobriety. He served his country in the US Army during the Korean War. He also served on the Board of the North Museum.

Mary and Larry met in Sea Island, GA in 1954 and enjoyed their homes on Hawkins Island, Sea Island, GA and Bethany Beach, DE. He was known for his mischiefs, humor, intellect and big heart. Those who had the pleasure to know Larry will never forget him.
