Linda L. Timberlake, 68, of Lancaster, passed away unexpectedly at her home on Wednesday, January 18, 2017. Born in Westtown Township, Chester County, PA, she was the daughter of the late Frank and Hope Lauter Willis. Linda was the wife of Terry Hatch, together they celebrated their 29th wedding anniversary on Valentines Day, February 14, 2016. Linda was a devoted and a proud mother to her daughter, Lisa Hatch Timberlake. Lisa continues her mother's spirit of service as a Hospice social worker in Lancaster.

Linda was a graduate of Wilmington College of Ohio and Temple Law School. She started her career as a social worker for the Philadelphia Housing Authority. Following her graduation from Temple Law School she worked for MidPenn Legal Services for 36 years, specializing on working with the elderly and infirmed of Lancaster County. She was honored for her life long commitment to Equal Justice in 2014 winning the Pennsylvania Legal Aid Excellence Award.

Due to her love of animals, she volunteered with ORCA (Organization for the Responsible Care of Animals) in Lancaster. She was presented with the Friend of Animals award by ORCA in 2015. She was also involved with many other animal support groups throughout Lancaster and the nation.
