Lloyd Nolan Hall (71) loving husband, father, grandfather, brother and friend, entered eternal rest on Wednesday, May 4, 2016. Born in Havaco (McDowell County) WV on 10/12/1944. Child of C. Leland Hall and Josephine Susie (Grobosky) Hall. Survived by his wife, Joyce, daughters: Susan Joy Fenstermaker (William C. III) and Gail Marie Hall, a granddaughter, Eve Joy and grandson, Seth Charles. He is also survived by three sisters: Phyllis Compton, Terry Rauls and Marcella Cain (Gerald). Preceded in death by a brother, Thomas.

Lloyd was a member of the Leola United Methodist Church (9 years) and Ross Street United Methodist Church, Lancaster, 34 years previous.

He was a member of Charles M. Howell Lodge No. 496 F. & A.M. where he is also a Past Master. Lloyd was also a member of the Lancaster Lodge of Perfection, the Harrisburg consistory and appendant bodies and Royal Arch Chapter 43, Lancaster.
