Margaret (Meg) Louise Fox Shaiebly went to be with the Lord on Saturday, August 29, 2015. She died of natural causes in her sleep. She was 91.

Along with her first husband, she served as a missionary in Japan with SEND International for 35 years, establishing churches and bringing the word of God to the Japanese. She also worked in The Netherlands at Tyndale Theological Seminary for four years before moving to Lancaster County. She worked at Lancaster Bible College as a Missionary-in-Residence. She worked equipping college students to become followers of Christ.

She dedicated her life to the Lord when she was a teenager and spent all of her adult life serving God. Her motto in life was “Jesus Never Fails”.

She wrote thousands of letters over the years and every one started with “Jesus Never Fails.” The letters then went on to praise God for how Jesus always provided for all needs in everything.

She was born to Homer and Irma Mayers on May 31, 1924 in Canton, Ohio. She was married to Roger W. Fox for 49 years until he entered into the Lord’s presence in 1995. She married Earl Shaiebly of Lancaster, PA on June 4, 2004.

She is survived by daughter Linda (Don) Sabatini in Lancaster, sons Timothy (Joan) Fox in Texas, Gary (Gaylynn) Fox in Arizona; Cynthia (Robert) Shaieby Rinaldi in Florida and Gordon (Jerrie) Shaieby in Oklahoma; 16 grandchildren and 30 great-grandchildren.

A memorial service will be held at 11:00 a.m. Wednesday, September 2, 2015 in the Chapel at Calvary Church, 1051 Landis Valley Road, in Lancaster.
