Marjorie Jane (Klahre) Taylor, 95, formerly of Hollidaysburg and Altoona, PA, passed away on Saturday, April 19, 2014 in Lancaster, PA. "Margie" was born on December 18, 1918 in Altoona, PA to Bernard and Grace (Stoke) Klahre. Her sister, Virginia and brother, Robert, preceded her in death. On May 20, 1945 Margie married Hawn Samuel Taylor at Simpson Methodist Church in Altoona. Sam passed away on April 18, 1989 and their only son, Richard, passed away on May 14, 2003.

Margie was a 1936 graduate of Altoona High School and attended Penn State for two years. She was employed by Sears, Stellabotte and J&M printing in Altoona as both a bookkeeper and office manager.
