Marlene Ann Carpenter, 90, of Lancaster, PA, was called to join her heavenly family and friends on Tuesday, December 12, 2023. She died peacefully at Homestead Village surrounded by family and the dedicated, compassionate staff of Apostles Care Center. Born in Geneva, NY, she was the daughter of the late Dr. Willard F. and Lucille Guilfus Crosier and the wife of Ronald C. Carpenter, 68 years. Marlene's gentle spirit will be deeply missed and forever in our hearts.

A 1950 graduate of Geneva High School, Marlene studied premed at Cornell University, graduating with a bachelor's degree in 1955. Her life journey with Ronald led to Lowville, Lyons Falls, Minetto, Oswego, NY and Lancaster in 1974. Marlene was a lifelong learner and lived her life as a woman of faith.

Marlene genuinely cherished times with her family, friends, attending concerts, plays, traveling, camping, genealogy research, gardening (she had a green thumb like her father), avid baking (like her mother), sewing, knitting and

crafting.
