Maxine S. Boodis, 83, of Lancaster, PA, died Friday, May 17, 2013 at Lancaster General Hospital after a brief illness. Born in Bryn Mawr, PA, she was the daughter of the late Meyer and Reba Rosen Snyder.

Highly intelligent and hard working, Maxine earned a bachelor's degree from Temple University in Philadelphia and a master's degree from Simmons College in Boston. She began her professional career as an elementary school teacher in the Philadelphia School District, after which she became a business librarian and worked for, among other companies, Coopers and Lybrand.

She was a devoted and loving wife to her beloved husband Leo K. Boodis, with whom she enjoyed a 25-year marriage until Leo died in 1978. She also dedicated her life to raising her only child, a job she performed with deep love and great passion. Maxine adored her two grandsons. She loved dogs, especially standard schnauzers, and adopted three during her life. She was an ardent fan of the Philadelphia Phillies.

Maxine is survived by her daughter, Melanie, wife of William R. Stoycos, of Lancaster, and her grandchildren Noah and Alexander Stoycos. In addition to her husband, she was preceded in death by her brothers Allen and Robert Snyder.
