Melvyn “Mel” Paul Rozelle, 86, passed away peacefully at his Lancaster home, surrounded by his family, Thursday morning, December 17th due to COVID 19.

Mel was born in Scranton, PA to the late Joseph Charles and Blanch (Kornesky) Rozelle. He was married to his wife Shirley J. (Bath) Rozelle for nearly 60 years.

Mel served his country proudly as a member of the U.S. Army. After his service, he moved to Northern New Jersey, a region he was proud to live most of his adult life. It was at a nightclub in Wildwood, NJ that he met the love of his life and the mother of his children, Shirley.

Mel had a dynamic and successful professional career. He served as President of GenCorp in NYC, Vice President of International Telephone and Telegraph and the National Corrosion Engineer for Sherwin Williams N.A. Mel was also awarded the Dale Carnegie Highest Achievement Certification and Leadership Award. He is well known and respected by all clients, restaurateurs, and hotel managers from New York to Lancaster. In addition to his wife, Mel is survived by his three daughters, Melissa B. Rotay (Steve) of Lancaster, Traci B. Frederick (Kent) of Chester Springs, PA and Allyson A. Grecco (Jason) of Oceanview, NJ. He adored his grandchildren: Taylor, Samantha, Blair, Haydn, Nicolette and Joseph.
