Nancy M. Bull, 78, of Lancaster, died peacefully on Sunday, April 19, 2020 at Homestead Village. Formerly a resident of Quarry Lane, Nancy was born in Brooklyn, NY, the daughter of the late Eugene and Dorothy Kromuller Moore. She was married to Michael Bull for 55 years.

Growing up in Brooklyn, NY, Nancy graduated from Roslyn High School and enjoyed listening to the Brooklyn Dodgers on the radio. She graduated from the University of Pittsburgh where she studied Elementary Education and was a member of the Kappa Kappa Gamma Sorority. It was there that Nancy met Michael and they were later married. A traditional housewife, she adored her children and loved Halloween and Christmas. “ I met Nancy for the first time in the Fall of 1989 when Jon and I were falling in love. We had dinner reservations at The Wilson Walker House in Lexington Virginia so I could meet Jon's parents for the first time. I remember seeing Nancy's sweet smile across the table in the glow of the dinner candles.

Visits to lovely Lancaster started shortly thereafter. I remember getting up early on Quarry Lane to chat with Nancy over coffee and hear stories about when Jon was little or her early years as a teacher or happenings in the neighborhood.

Having been born and raised in Texas, I was so happy and excited to be in another part of the country learning about the customs of Lancaster County. It was so refreshing to be yourself and leave the Texas beauty standards at the door. Hors d'oeuvres before dinner like lebanon bologna roll ups with cheese and little breadsticks, I never knew about this before Lancaster. I was so proud to be dating a boy from Pennsylvania, whos mom was from Long Island and Dad from Philly. And later on getting to meet the rest of the New York City/ Long Island crew from Nancy's family brought me so much joy.

There have been countless visits to Lancaster over the years and each time a feeling of excitement and comfort came as Jon and I turned onto Quarry Lane and pulled into the driveway of Nance and Mike. I loved going to Lancaster's market, dining at Strawberry Hill, sitting on the deck with Nancy talking about the butterfly bush and life in general. Nancy's kitchen was always stocked with fun candies and snacks from market, sandwich making supplies, pretzels, bagels, Lancaster corn and melons.

Jon and I got married summer of 1992. We have three children and Nancy was there for all three births. She helped Jon and I tremendously as we adjusted to having a tiny baby in our care. She knew just what a new mom and dad needed and assured us everything was going to be ok. Nancy offered advice in a caring gentle way that allowed Jon and I to see a different perspective but

figure things out as a couple.

Nancy always knew just the right toy or book to get for the kids having been a school teacher. She would also let Jon and I know if we were expecting to much from the kids and to lighten things up a little. Visits to Lancaster with our kids always included a trip to the North Museum for Sam with a purchase from the gift shop or a trip to Toys R Us or Park City mall for a little shopping for Rose and Quinn. There were pancake (Bisquick in a bottle) breakfasts and cookouts with the most amazing summer produce from Lancaster. She made everything special.

Nancy never missed a birthday, anniversary, holiday or special occasion. She and Mike flew to Dallas when they could to see the kids take part in musicals, plays or soccer games. Nancy always had her Lumix camera that she would give to Jon or I to document the visit. I cherish the beach trips that we shared over the years from Ocean City to Avon. NC and Topsail. And as the grandkids grew older Nancy was always available for a chat on the beach house porch. She was patient with all the shenanigans that took place. And as the grandkids ran in and out of the beach house they could stop and sit at Nan's porch table and visit.

Happy Mother's Day to Nancy. She was an amazing lady that accepted you no matter what. Most of all, I am forever grateful for Nancy for raising three amazing children, Jenny, Jon, and Liz. I am married to Jon but have gained two sisters. I love you all and I am so blessed to have you in my life and to be a part of the Moore/Bull family.

“ Nancy, or Nana as my siblings and I called here, was a very special person in my life. I'm the oldest of her grandchildren. She was there when I was born in Springfield, Massachusetts on November 15, 1994. When we still lived in the Northeast until I was four, we saw her and Michael Bull, Granddaddy, very often, but I don't remember much from that time. After we moved to Texas, traveling to visit her in Lancaster was one of the highlights of the year. She seemed to always know just what I was into at the time and understand why it interested me, whether it was cooking, fossils or American history. I remember her taking me to the North Museum, the natural history museum in Lancaster, as kid where I was astounded by their interactive taxidermy, fossil collection, and gift shop. When I was into cooking, she was patient enough to help me make my own cake that had an extensive ingredient list with no recipe. She avidly watched the whole 4+ hour Gettysburg movie with me before our trip there. Sometimes they would visit Dallas, and I remember being so excited to show her our city, even though I thought it was nowhere as cool as Lancaster. As I grew up, and became a teenager and beyond, our relationship changed, but the care and love she put into it never did. In those years she always offered a different, often humorous, perspective on my life developments that I'd recount to her when we visited, and she teased me that I was getting "so handsome" to which I feigned embarrassment but actually appreciated. Nana was as great a grandmother as anyone could ask for, and I'm so thankful I got to spend so many years with her! As we used to say to each other (something that she thought of a long time ago but which I ended up telling her for the last time over the phone when she was sick): I love you more than all the stars in the sky, in the galaxy, and the universe--Samuel Bull

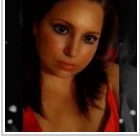
