Nancy Croll Sell, 70, of Lititz, PA, passed away on Tuesday, July 21, 2015 at Hospice & Community Care, Mt. Joy facility, after a courageous battle with cancer. Born in Federalsburg, MD to the late Paul Addison Croll and Alice Reagan Croll, she was happily married to Greg Sell for thirty-five years.

Nancy earned a BFA and MFA from East Carolina University as well as a degree in computer programming from Pitt Community College.
