Paul E. Todd, 94, of Lancaster, passed away Sunday, March 24, 2024 at Penn Medicine Lancaster General Hospital, after a brief illness. He was the husband of Joan Morgan Todd, to whom he would have been married 57 years on May 27th. Born in Lancaster, Paul was the son of the late John L. and Laura S. Killian Todd.

He was a graduate of McCaskey High School. Paul joined the United States Air Force in 1950 and was stationed in Puerto Rico during the Korean War.

He worked as a carpenter his entire adult life, retiring from Clayton E. Gerlach in 1994. Paul took great pride in his craftsmanship and never walked away from a job until it was perfect. He continued his passion for building after retiring, volunteering for many years with Habitat for Humanity.

Paul enjoyed bowling and hunting throughout his life. He was a longtime member of Indian Run hunting camp in Potter County and enjoyed spending time there each deer season with his brother-in-law, Jeep.

Paul was well-known for his homemade chocolate candy, which he gifted to friends and family each Christmas and Easter. He also enjoyed spending time in the garden, tending to his flowers.

He was a lifetime member of Ascension Lutheran Church, where he was active in the choir and building committee.

In addition to his wife, Paul is survived by his daughter, Jennifer Fulginiti, wife of Jason; his brother, Robert Todd; and several nieces and nephews.

As well as his parents, he was preceded in death by his sister, Evelyn Seiple, and brother, Gerald Todd.

A Memorial Service will be held at Ascension Lutheran Church, 600 Penn Grant Road, Willow Street on Saturday, May 11, 2024 at 12 noon. A visitation will be held from 11 a.m. until the time of the service.
