Richard N. "Pat, Kiddie, Kitty" Carr, age 77 of Lancaster, PA died on Friday, August 14, 2020 of complications after a recent surgery. He was born on May 28, 1943 in Lancaster, PA to his late parents, Leroy C. Carr, Sr. and Magdalene (Phelan) Carr.

Pat was a lifelong resident of Lancaster City and a graduate of J.P. McCaskey High School. He worked for over 30 years at Armstrong World Industries until his retirement at age 52 to enjoy the good life. Pat was a social and outgoing man and you never had to doubt where he was in the room because his booming voice would let you know!! He was an avid Baltimore Orioles baseball fan and enjoyed sports in general. He also was a lifelong fan of the KING, Elvis Presley.
