Bob was a proud graduate of Lancaster Catholic High School, Class of 1971. He attended the Philadelphia College of Pharmacy from 1971 to 1973 and earned his nursing degree from HACC School of Nursing in 2011.

A man of deep faith and service, Bob was an active member of the Knights of Columbus and a devoted parishioner of St. Anthony of Padua Catholic Church.

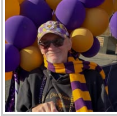

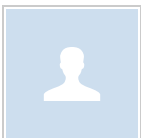
