Bob lived next to the Hunsecker covered Bridge and we played a lot of weekends and summer days, hours upon hours in that bridge and the Pinetown covered bridge and surrounding Norman Rockwell like country side and along the Conestoga Creek. We once had our picture taken for the Intelligencer Journal on a Horse and Sleigh very close to the Hunsecker Bridge.
