Sally Ann (Huber) Hess, 82, passed away on Wednesday, December 11, 2019 at Brereton Manor. Born in Lancaster, PA, she was the daughter of the late Edward Charles and Dorothy Anna Hedricks Huber.

A 1956 graduate of Penn Manor High School, she was the first and only girl in their Agricultural Program. Sally owned Celest Kennels which bred, sold and showed standard poodles. She also was an employee and then became owner of a dog grooming business. Sally was a member of Pequea Brethren in Christ Church.

In her yearbook she was described as an avid horse fan – owning a mare – with an ambition to one day run a riding stable.

She is survived by her sons: Jeff Hess, Columbia, PA, Ray Hess, Mountville, PA and Scott Hess, husband of Robin, Conestoga, PA, her brothers: Jay Huber, Guatemala and Terrance Huber, Encino, CA.

Sally said that Muddy was "a little boy with a biggy boy attitude". I joined the Lancaster Kennel Club with her, and we went to dog shows together as well. We had many fun times going to the National Poodle Club of America shows in Maryland. One time we drove her old blue chevy station wagon with loose steering & bad shocks to a dog show where she was showing a black Standard named Holly who was Jax's sister. Unfortunatley, she got car sick and drooled all the way to the show held in Williamsport, PA. When we arrived at the show we had to take a blow dryer to dry and brush out her coat before we could enter the show ring. She didn't win or even get a ribbon, and it was stifling hot that day. The poor dog then had to suffer all the way home with the sloppy ride and all the turns in the mountains back to Lancaster. We always shared laughs about our adventures later. She loved my daughter Allison who was 5 when we got our first Poodle, Gabby. Since Allison didn't have any grand-parents who lived nearby, she always said that Allison was her "adopted" grandmother. When Allison was in high-school, she would go to Sally's shop and help her was and groom the dogs. In the spring, Sally and I went shopping for flowers to plant. She had the best green thumb, and she enjoyed finding exotic flowers that didn't grow in PA. I don't know how many friends I convinced to buy a Poodle when they were looking for a dog. No one was ever disappointed by Sally's dogs. They were beautiful, had wonderful termperments, and healthy. Since we taught at Millersville, we would take Sally to the plays at the theatre, ballets, and other cultural and muscial events. She was always happy to go but often fell asleep because she worked hard all day. But, she always said that the shows were wonderful! She was the kindest, most thoughtful person I have ever known. Even though she didn't have much money, she contributed to all sorts of organizations, and fell victim to anyone with a sad story or scam artist due to her good heart. Sadly, I moved to Michigan 10 years ago and visited her at Breteton

Manor about 2 years ago. She no longer knew who I was, and I brought my Poodle, Giselle with me. She didn't remember having dogs either and didn't even seem eager to pet her. When I left we would talk on the phone frequently, send cards for holidays, and pictures. I knew she was getting forgetful but didn't know bad she had gotten when I came to visit. She looked great and was happy, but I knew she didn't remember me. I sent card but hadn't heard from her in the last year and feared the worst. My memories of you, Sally, are rich and loving.
