Sharon Andrews Hargrave, 81, of Lititz, PA died on Sunday, December 15, 2024. Born in Harrisburg, PA, she was the daughter of the late Luther Winfrey Andrews and Agnes Elizabeth Kocher. She was the beloved wife of the late Dr. Hugh John Hargrave.

Surviving her in Grand Rapids, MI is their son, Dr. Howard Andrews Hargrave; his wife, Anna; and two grandchildren: Madeleine and Zachary, also surviving her is her sister-in-law, Ann Arnett, of Coquitlam, BC.

Prior to settling in Lancaster County, she earned her nursing degree from Elizabethtown College and worked as a nurse as Hugh completed his training. While Hugh was a medical officer in the Navy in Vietnam, she worked as a nurse at the Seventh Day Adventist Hospital in Saigon.

Sharon was gregarious, always having time for others and catching up on what was new with them. She spearheaded domestic violence prevention when she was the president of the Lancaster County Medical Society Alliance.

Sharon was very passionate about Asian and Renaissance art and combined that with her love of the adventure of traveling to exotic locales, from the Gobi Desert to the Great Barrier Reef. A special joy was helping to plan and guide yearly trips to Florence, Italy, and there sharing her love of Renaissance Art

with fellow travelers from the Lancaster area.
