Sheila White Roseman, 78, passed on Friday, December 29, 2017 surrounded by her family at Lancaster General Hospital following a lengthy battle of heart disease and rheumatoid arthritis. Born in Lansing, Michigan to mother, Blanche White and father, Arthur Sigward Johnson, she was adopted by William Howard White, II in 1945. William was a captain during WWII training army corps of engineer troops.

Sheila was an Army Brat moving from Missouri to Chicago to Lancaster. She graduated from Manheim Township in 1957 and Reading Hospital School of Nursing in 1960. She was the Maternity Ward Head Nurse at LGH from 1960-1962.

The Mother of three girls, she was affectionately known as the nurse on the block selflessly assisting the neighborhood children when first aid was needed.

She volunteered at the YWCA and United Way of Lancaster and was recognized with a Yellow Rose Award. Both she and Don were recognized as Lancaster YWCA Citizens of the Year in 1992. Sheila enjoyed tending her lavish gardens and pond at her lifelong home in East Petersburg and vacation home in Lake Harmony, PA. She enjoyed traveling the states and the world, often on cruises with her husband.

She is survived by her husband, Donald K. Roseman, Jr. They were married 56 years. 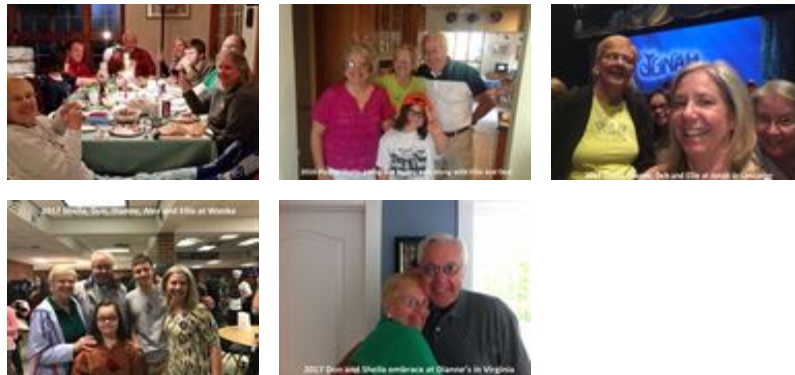
