



Tom J. DePaul

Artist, designer, athlete, sailor, world traveler an aficionado of fine food, good cigars, and aged scotch, Thomas J. DePaul died Friday, August 23rd of complications of Parkinsons, Multiple Myeloma, and Covid. He was 81. Born in Philadelphia, the son of Romeo and Mary Mancini DePaul. He was the husband of artist K.K.DePaul.

He graduated from Philadelphia College of Art, and in 1969, he and his first wife Ann moved to Lancaster to accept a position with Armstrong World Industries in their Design Dept.

In 1972, he left his position at Armstrong to establish DePaul Design, specializing in interior design. The offices were housed in a former tobacco warehouse where DePaul focused his design abilities on rehabilitating older buildings. By 1976, the firm had grown and moved to its location on Arch St in downtown Lancaster.

During a chance meeting in an Italian class, he met the woman who would become his best friend, and later, his second wife. They sat at a table in a cafe in Paris, and decided to pursue a life in art. Tom rekindled an old love of painting, and in 2005, together they opened Gallery DePaul on the first floor of Tom's building on Arch St. In addition to mounting monthly art exhibits, Tom and Kim taught a series of photography workshops in Paris, Florence, and

Venice.
