Walter H. Pogue, Jr. went to be with His Lord on Wednesday, May 9, 2018 at the Mennonite Home in Lancaster, PA. Born in Parkesburg, PA, he was the son of the late Walter H. Pogue and Florence E. (McAllister) Pogue.

He graduated from Valley Forge Military Academy and Virginia Polytechnic Institute. His first job was a track engineer for the Pennsylvania Railroad. During the Korean War, he served in the Army Corps of Engineers in England. After the war, he earned an MBA from Harvard Business School. Walter held positions with Lukens Steel and American Car and Foundry. He was general manager of the freight car division of General American Transportation and president of Berwick Forge and Fabricating Corporation. In later years, he was self-employed as a consultant in the rail car industry. He was a member of the Union League Club of Chicago and the Pittsburgh Traffic Club.

Walter loved playing drums, model trains, the railroad industry, Lancaster history, and classic movies.

He is survived by his son, John Pogue, husband of Pamela; his daughter, Kari Pogue of Germantown, MD; their mother, Ann Pogue of Lancaster; his grandchildren: Julia Pogue of Philadelphia, Andrew Pogue of Lancaster, and Katelyn Pogue of Lancaster.

Funeral services will be held at The Groffs Family Funeral and Cremation Services, 528 West Orange Street (corner of W. Orange & Pine Sts.), Lancaster, PA on Saturday, May 19, 2018 at 11:00 a.m. The family will receive friends from 10:30 a.m. until time of service.
