William R. Hendricks, 97, of Millersville, Pennsylvania, formerly of East Hartford, Connecticut, departed this life peacefully in his home on Sunday, November 1, 2015. He was born on January 11, 1918 in New Haven, Connecticut, the son of Benjamin Forrest Hendricks and Gertrude Sullivan Hendricks. He was preceded in death by his wife of 68 years, Elizabeth Lynch Hendricks, his brother, Benjamin Hendricks and his sister Mabel Amari. He is survived by his daughter, Mary Hendricks Glazier, his grandson James Hendricks Glazier, and his son-in-law, Penn B. Glazier, of Conestoga. He is also survived by five nieces and nephews.

He was a standout athlete at East Hartford High School and played football for the University of Connecticut. He proudly served in the U.S. Army Air Corps with the 529th Fighter Squadron (Flying Tigers) in India and China during World War II. In partnership with his brother, he managed the Olmsted Carroll Insurance Agency in East Hartford, Connecticut, and continued working in the insurance industry well into his 80s.

He was a lifelong Catholic and a devoted husband, father and grandfather. He loved sports, gardening and baking cakes and pies. He embraced modern technology, regularly listening to audiobooks and following friends and family through social media.
