William T. Heidig, 80 of Lancaster, died suddenly at Lancaster General Hospital in Lancaster, PA on Wednesday, February 25, 2015. Born in Lancaster he was the son of the late Andrew J. Heidig and Louella Trout Heidig. He was married for 61 years to Mary Lou Auer Heidig.

Bill graduated from J.P. McCaskey High School in 1953 and received an associate's degree in Fire Science at HACC, graduating in 1978. He served on the Lancaster City Fire Department for 34 years and retired in 1996 as a Lieutenant. He also had his business that he owned and operated, Heidig's Antenna and Satellite Service.

Bill was a 32nd Degree Free and Accepted Mason. He was a member of the Lancaster Elks Club, Manheim Band Club, Lancaster Scuba Diver Club, Lancaster 8th and 7th Ward Club, Lancaster Professional Firefighters – AFF Local 319. He also enjoyed hunting, boating, and scuba diving in his spare time.
